The First Staff Development Day was held on 17 October 2019. It started with 'Teachers & School Management Sexuality Education Training' by Mothers' Choice. The training was well-received with colleagues putting a lot of time and effort in the discussion and the presentation. The second session was the 'iWork for Lesson Design and Self-directed Learning Workshop' by Apple Inc. Education Development. Teachers were enthusiastic about learning to use new platforms and apps in their teaching and was ready to try out the new strategies they had acquired.

The afternoon programme of Subject-based Enhancement Programme arranged by individual Departments or KLAs was the highlight of the day. The English and Hindi Department paid a visit to the Temple of International Society of Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) for spiritual awakening. Other more cultural oriented programmes included visit to XiQu Centre to understand traditional Chinese culture in arts and tea by the Chinese & NCS Chinese Departments and City Gallery and City Hall Library to explore the resources about Hong Kong's major planning proposal by the Economics Department.

The Chinese History Department attended the Learning Circle for supporting NCS students to study Chinese History at EDB Kowloon Tong Education Service Centre and the Visual Arts Department had an interflow with the VA teachers at Kowloon Technical School for teaching strategies on ceramics making. The teachers of PE Department immersed themselves in a workshop of ice-skating at one of the renowned ice-skating rink in Hong Kong.

A panel of judges comprising teachers from various subject disciplines evaluated the students' performances. This year's champions were selected from different categories such as singing, dance and other performances. In the singing category, 4D Rana Seran dazzled the audience with her most spectacular performance of the song 'No One', which was originally sung by Alicia Keys, a famous American singer, songwriter and musician. In the category of dance, Nepalese students 5E Thapa Saniya, 6C Rai Monica and 6C Gurung Shima bagged the championship with their stunning dance performance in a Hindi song. In

In the afternoon of 8 November 2019, our English Department hosted the S6 Inter-school English Oral Practice in the school hall. The 150 participants from our school, Helen Liang Memorial Secondary School (Shatin) and Kowloon Technical School honed their English language speaking skills by sharing their ideas and opinions about selected topics in the group interactions, and then delivering one-minute individual responses. The session culminated in the 'Inter-school Individual Response Challenge' when three representatives —one from each school — were pitted against each other. The three contestants gave great responses, and the constructive comments from teachers gave them food for thought to help them improve their performance in the speaking paper.

All-in-all, the English oral practice session was productive and fruitful, and it provided an opportunity for the three schools to forge ties through collaboration.

STEM Education

STEM is an acronym of the words Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. In recent years, our school has actively promoted STEM education, enabling students to acquire interdisciplinary learning skills and to cultivate innovative thinking and problem-solving skills.

In STEM for S2, students can learn LEGO EV3 robot and program during the lesson time. The programme has enabled our students to develop creativity, problems solving and collaboration skills while consolidating their knowledge in science, technology, engineering and Mathematics. There is also a STEM programme for ALL in which 13 selected students have joined a drone training program after school. Students can learn the way of controlling drone and developing the suitable control programme.

18th Singapore-Hong Kong Exchange Prorgramme 2019

The Singapore-Hong Kong Exchange Programme is a signature programme between Singapore Ministry of Education (MOE) and Hong Kong Education Bureau (EDB). The theme in 2019 is Open Minds, Open Hearts, which reminds all of us to be proactive and empathetic in reaching out and connecting with friends from different cultures and backgrounds.

Out of 59 students from 8 secondary schools, 3 of our students (Tang Pik Shan Angel, Li Yin Ho Wendy and Pan Lingxin Tom) were lucky enough to be selected to join this programme which was held on 13 to 20 July 2019. They spent their summer holiday immerging themselves at West Spring Secondary School in Singapore during the weekdays and had fun-filled time with their buddies and host families during the weekend. Apart from attending regular lessons at West Spring, they also got chances to enrich their knowledge on horticulture and wildlife animals at Gardens by the Bay and River Safari respectively during the programme.

Exchange Summer Camp 20

The Beijing, Hong Kong and Macau Student Exchange Summer Camp 2019 was held in Beijing from 21 to 27 July 2019. Five S6 students, including Gurleen Kaur, Pun Babita, Wong Hang Yu, Wong Whitney and Aslam Maira, participated in the camp with Ms. Dunn Ling as the teacher representative.

It has provided an opportunity for a meaningful inter-flow among students and teachers of the three places and to equip participants with knowledge of the culture, history and the updated developments in China.

There were altogether 300 students and 30 teachers participating in the programme.

We visited many places like Sports University, the Great Wall of China, the Summer Palace and the Forbidden City. It was amazing to see in person the flag raising ceremony in the Tiananmen Square. Taiwan Study Tour

The Study Tour to Taiwan 2019 was held on 29 November 2019. It was organized by the Career Team. 15 students of S4 to S6 and 2 teachers joined the 3-day trip and visited the Ming Chuan University and National Taiwan Normal University. Students have learned the possibilities and procedures of applying to Taiwan universities and the learning style in Taiwan.

Students tried the local delicacies at the famous Raoche Street Night Market (饒河街夜市), went shopping at Jiufen (九份山城), flew sky lantern at Shifen (十份) and visited the Eslite Bookstore (誠品書店). They also visited the Palace Museum to learn more about the history of Chinese art from the Neolithic age to the modern time, and the collection of treasures kept by generations of Emperors ruling from the Forbidden City.

Our students found it a great pleasure to experience the living and life styles of students in Taiwan. It was truly an eye-opening and fruitful journey to all of them.
