Speech Day




Sir Ellis Kadoorie Secondary School (West Kowloon) held its Speech Day on 25 May 2023. The day was marked by commendation of students' excellent academic achievements and extracurricular performances.

The ceremony kicked off with the Principal's report on the students' achievements in external and internal examinations. In the academic front, the school achieved an outstanding result in English Language in the 2022 HKDSE Examination with 90% passing rate which is 11.5% higher than the HK average. For the high achievers, four students entered The University of Hong Kong and student entered The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Our Principal, Mr. Lee Tung-ching, also reported the students' excellent performances in various extracurricular, aesthetic and value education fields. Students with excellent performances in academic as well as different extracurricular fields were awarded certificates and various scholarships.

The Kahoot Math Riddles Competition for S4 students was another exhilarating event, with teams competing in a round of 30 riddles. Eric of 4A provided explanations after each riddle, making the competition informative and enjoyable for everyone. The competition was an excellent way for the students to practice their language and problem-solving skills. The Barracks (Binam and William of 4B, and Dietrich of 4A) emerged as the champions, and they undoubtedly deserved their victory.

The S5 Impromptu Prose Reading Competition was another highlight of the week, with several contestants participating in both the monologue and duologue competitions. The students showcased their language skills and creativity through their performances of extracts from Mr. Mystery by James Lee, and the judges had a tough time deciding the winners. Jumin of 5B shone as the champion of the monologue competition, while he and his partner, Scido of 5C, were the champions of the duologue competition. These events provided a platform for the students to express themselves effectively and showcase their language skills with flair.

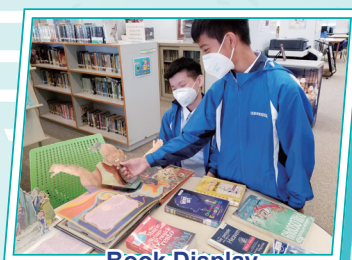

VR Project for Chinese Language Education

To enhance NCS students learning of Chinese with technology, the NCS Chinese Department joined the VR Project for Chinese Language Education which is held by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, Centre for Learning Sciences and Technologies - the Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Literature Research Centre.

Virtual reality technology can create a simulated environment that enables learners to immerse themselves in real-life situations, making learning more interactive and engaging and help NCS students learn Chinese.

One of the challenges that NCS students face is the complexity of the Chinese language. Chinese characters, pronunciation, and grammar can be challenging to understand and remember. Virtual reality technology can provide a more interactive and immersive learning experience, making it easier for students to understand and remember the characters. By using virtual reality, students can practice speaking, listening, and writing Chinese in a virtual environment replicating real-life situations. This allows students to communicate with virtual characters and receive immediate feedback, which can improve their language skills.

Another advantage of virtual reality technology is that it can provide a personalized learning experience and help NCS students overcome cultural barriers. Students can learn about Chinese culture and customs by immersing themselves into the language environment. This can help students understand the context of the language and better communicate with native Chinese speakers.

In conclusion, virtual reality technology has excellent potential to help NCS students learn Chinese. Virtual reality can provide a more interactive and immersive learning experience by creating a simulated environment replicating real-life situations.

Most students think that the virtual reality technology together with the NCS Chinese teachers' effective teaching, not only helps them learn more Chinese vocabulary but it also enhances their motivation helps them learn learn Chinese and promotes their Chinese writing skills; making them more involved in Chinese classes and has more interactive learning opportunities with their classmates.

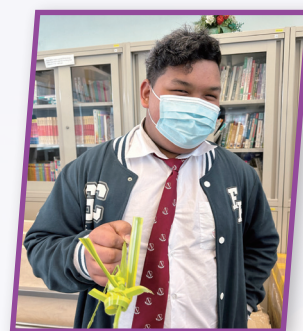

cultural context. This can help them see the language as more than just a set of words and grammar rules but as a living, breathing part of a vibrant culture.

In addition, we have Cantonese Day, Cantonese & Putonghua Songs Dedication, Inter-class Chinese Cultural Knowledge Competition and Film Showing of “Find Your Voice.” All these activities can significantly enhance their motivation to learn the language. By incorporating cultural practices, festivals, and events into the curriculum, such as the “Mid-Autumn Festival Poetry Matching Event” held on 10 September 2022, subject teachers can help students appreciate Chinese culture and feel a sense of belonging to the Chinese community.

Non-Chinese Student Docent Training Pilot Project

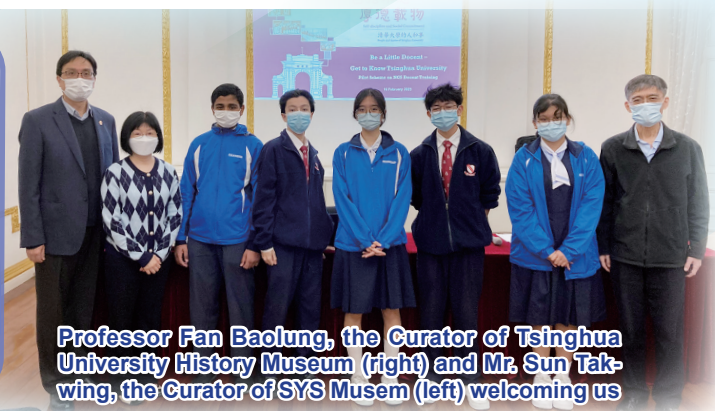

project was organised by the Dr Sun Yat-sen (SYS) Museum. Five S3 students from SEK, Talha, Gielisha, On Yan, Ruby and Kayden, took the initiative to embrace the challenges to be the first student docents.

Stage 1: Training

In order to equip the participants with the basic skills of docent, a professional training programme was offered by SYS Museum on 16 Feb 2023.

Follow-up training was conducted by the Head of the Chinese History Department, Ms. Lee Suet-fong, at school on school days or via Zoom at weekends and even on public holidays.

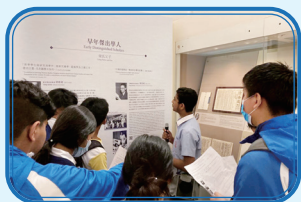

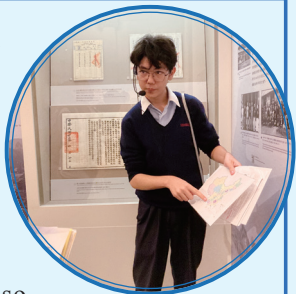
I learned a lot about the history of Tsinghua University as well as the six famous scholars who contributed largely to the early years' development of the university.

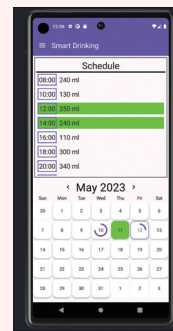

Talk and Tour in HKUST

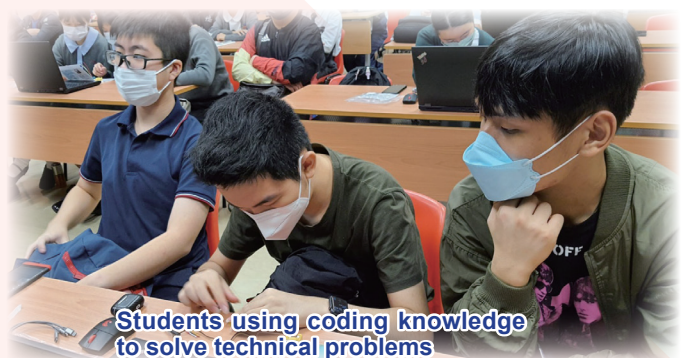

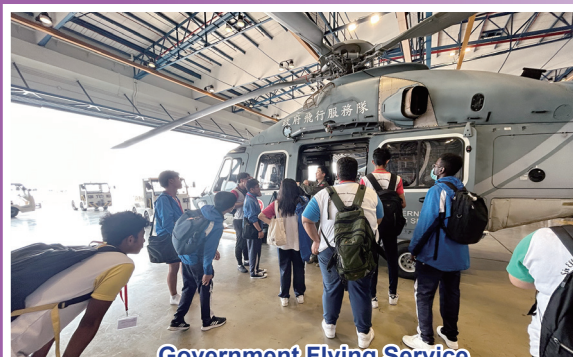

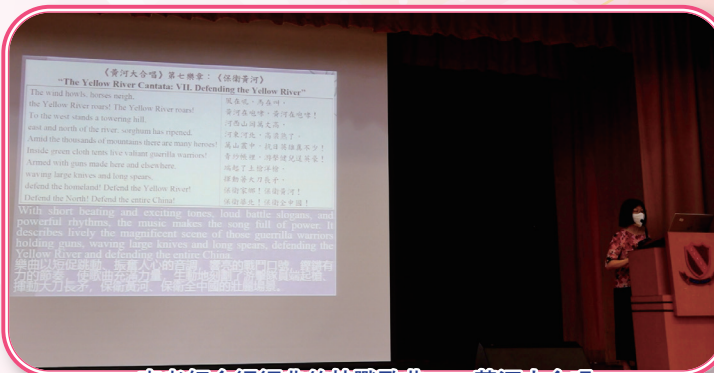

To exhibit their sense of national security, our students participated in the programme which consists of an online quiz competition and a Bulletin Board Design Competition.



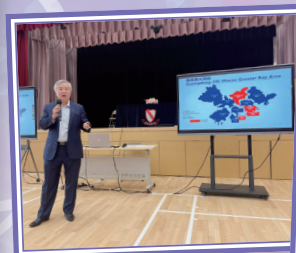
IV. Parents Education

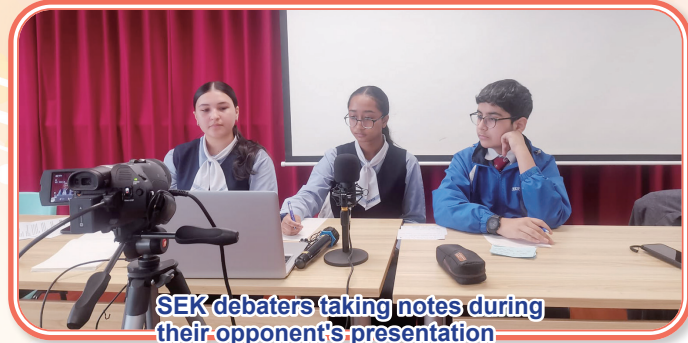
Megan Chen (3D) bagged the Best Debater Award in the Third Preliminary round of the competition even though the team lost to the opponent team in this round.

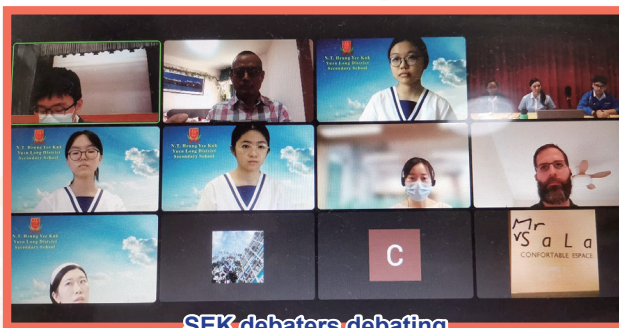

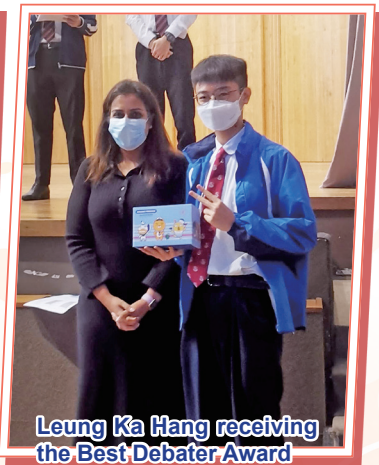

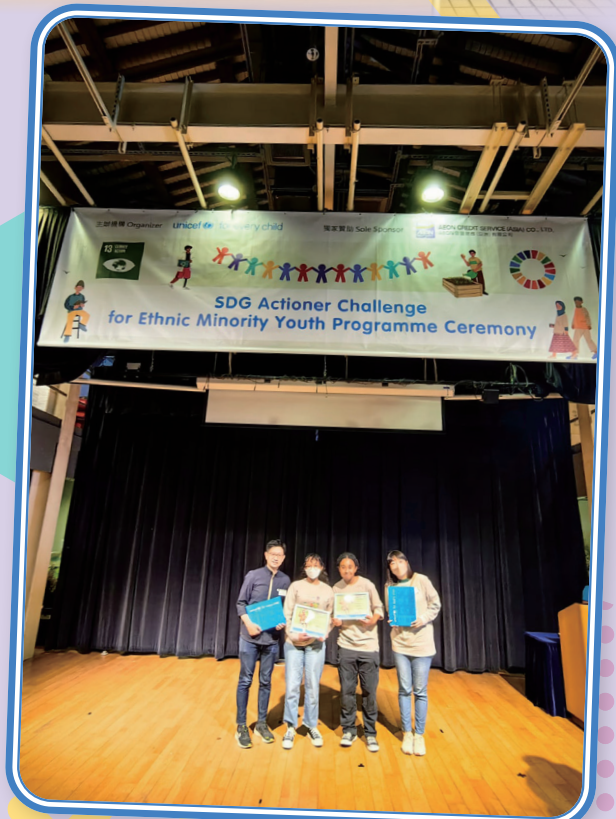
